Some ideas:

- An exciting story you cannot keep to yourself. The story may be personal, sensational, incredible, humorous, etc.
- An event that is about to take place or that has already taken place,
 e.g. a robbery, a wedding, etc.
- Abuse (e.g. domestic violence, drug/substance abuse).

1.2 I felt like I was in heaven.

Write a story about what you experienced to make you feel that way.

Some ideas:

- A positive experience (e.g. exciting, happy, relaxing).
- A happy, exciting, special, insightful moment.

1.3 I am truly proud of my family.

Some ideas:

- Description of some of the members of your family.
- The problems/challenges they have had to face.
- What they have achieved.

1.4 This is our country.

Some ideas:

- Description of the beautiful aspects of the country.
- Description of the people of the country.
- Description of the changes that the country is undergoing and has undergone.

1.5 The perfect friend

Some ideas:

- Description of a close friend OR the type of person you would want as a friend.
- The qualities that make him/her the perfect friend.
- Some important moments you have shared with your friend.

1.6 He/She always brings a smile to my face.

Some ideas:

- Description of the person who brings you joy.
- Your relationship with the person.
- How this person has changed your life.



You are going to study at a college or university in another town, where you have relatives. You do not have enough money to pay for accommodation in the hostel as it is too expensive.

Write a letter to one of your relatives, enquiring whether you can stay with them during the time that you will be studying.

Some ideas:

- Explain why you need to be accommodated.
- Explain what other alternatives you have explored.
- Indicate how long you will stay.
- Say how you plan to repay them.

2.3 **DIARY ENTRY**

You have recently had the privilege of meeting a famous person. Write a diary entry of this experience.

Start the entry with a date.

Some ideas:

- Circumstances of meeting.
- Place, date and time.
- Your feelings on meeting the famous person.
- Your interest in his/her career.

You and your friend are discussing what you want to do when you have completed matric. Write a dialogue in which you discuss your plans for the future.

Some ideas:

- Your friend's character/personality and achievements.
- Special moments shared with your friend.

Design a poster to advertise this event.

Your poster should include:

- An interesting heading or slogan.
- Date, time and venue.
- Different games/sports codes that can be played.

Some ideas:

- House:
 - Security measures (e.g. locking up the house and gates, switching the lights on and off, clearing the mail box).
- What to do in an emergency (e.g. whom to call, location of main switches and taps or medicine for your pet).
- Pet

Taking care of the pet (e.g. food, water, exercise).
