SCENARIO

Many school groups visit the SANBI (the South African National Biodiversity Institute) gardens. They are assisted in programmes run by the SANBI Environmental Education section.

Because you have an interest in fynbos, you have done research with SANBI. You would now like to share this information with learners at your school.

QUESTION 1: WORD PROCESSING

Open the **1Fynbos** word processing document and insert your examination number in the header.

1.1 Set the gutter margin of the document to 1 cm on the left.

NOTE: Ignore any warning messages that may appear. (1)

1.2 The document has a cover page.

Change the cover page as follows:

The word 'Fynbos' was placed in a text box. Replace the word 'Fynbos' with the picture **1Title_Titel.jpg** from your examination folder. (2)

1.3 Justify the text of the first paragraph in the document. (1)

1.4 Locate the letter 'F' of 'Fynbos' in the first paragraph on page 2 of the document. Apply a dropped cap effect to this letter as follows:

- The dropped cap must run over FIVE lines.
- The dropped cap must be 0.5 cm from the text. (3)

1.5 Locate the text that starts with 'WHAT IS FYNBOS?' and ends with '... within small areas'.







- Place the text into TWO columns.
- Ensure that the heading 'RICHNESS OF PLANT LIFE' always appears at the top of the second column. (2)

1.6 Locate the table after the paragraph that ends with '... within small areas'.

Use word processing features to make the necessary changes to the information and layout of the table in order to resemble the table below.

NOTE:

- The paragraphs in the table are sorted. (NO mark will be awarded for moving the text manually.)
- Take note of the alignment of the text, the formatting of the heading, as well as the outer border used.

Add a hyperlink to the text 'THREATS TO FYNBOS' to link to the picture **1Fire_Vuur.jpg** in your examination folder. (2)

1.8 Locate the text that starts with the heading 'CONSERVATION ACTION' and ends with '... in the fynbos.' in the next paragraph.

Place only this text in landscape orientation. All other pages should remain in portrait orientation. (2)

1.9 The bulleted text that appears under the heading 'CONSERVATION ACTION' must be formatted to a multilevel list so that it resembles the example below.

- A The promotion of public awareness of the Cape Floral Kingdom;
 - B Encouraging land owners to care for their fynbos;
 - C Setting aside important areas of land as nature reserves and national parks;
 - D The conservation of corridors of fynbos within urban areas;
 - E The promotion of ecotours, allowing people to experience the amazing floral diversity of fynbos;
 - F Control of alien, invasive vegetation;
 - G The promotion of environmental awareness exhibitions, for example on ...
 - i World Environment Day
 - ii Arbour Day
 - iii Fynbos Day
 - iv Careers exhibitions
 - v Marine Day
 - vi Care for the Earth Day

1.10 Locate the text 'DID YOU KNOW?' and remove the comment. (1)

1.11 Locate the heading 'ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS' below the text 'Gavin W Maneveldt. Botany Dept., University of the Western Cape'.

Add an endnote on the text 'ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS' as follows:

- Use the text above as the text for the endnote.
- Use the letter 'A' as a custom mark. (3)

1.12 Add an automatically generated bibliography after the text 'Add Bibliography here' at the end of the document.

NOTE: Ignore any warning messages that may appear. (1)

1.13 Insert the **1Wash_Was.gif** picture from your examination folder as a watermark on the last page only. (3)

Save and close the **1Fynbos** document. [29]

QUESTION 2: WORD PROCESSING

- 2.1 Format the form heading 'SANBI EDUCATIONAL WORKSHOP ENTRY FORM' to resemble the example on the previous page. (3)
- 2.2 Add the logo **2Sanbi.png** in your examination folder to appear in the position as shown in the example on the previous page.
Resize the logo so that the width is 8.1 cm and the height 3.6 cm. (4)
- 2.3 Format the heading 'Personal Information' to resemble the heading 'Contact Information', using the same style. (1)
- 2.4 The form uses legacy form controls. Some form field controls have been added to the form already.
Change the form as follows:
- 2.4.1 Set and apply appropriate tabs to align the form controls and the labels under the headings 'Personal Information' and 'Contact Information' as follows:
 - The first tab is set at 1 cm.
 - The second tab is set at 11 cm. (4)
- 2.4.2 Add the items 'Male' and 'Female' to the drop-down form field next to the word 'GENDER'. (2)
- 2.4.3 Add an appropriate form field control next to the text 'ID NUMBER'. This field should only accept 13 characters. (2)
- 2.4.4 Format the text form field control next to the text 'DATE OF BIRTH ' to allow only dates with the format yyyy/MM/dd. (2)
- 2.4.5 Add a control next to the text 'WEDNESDAY' that will be similar to the one above it in the form. (1)
- NOTE:** Do NOT lock or protect the form.
- 2.5 Add the text 'Entry form' to the document's subject property. (1)
- Save and close the **2Entry_Inskryw** document. **[20]**

QUESTION 3: SPREADSHEET

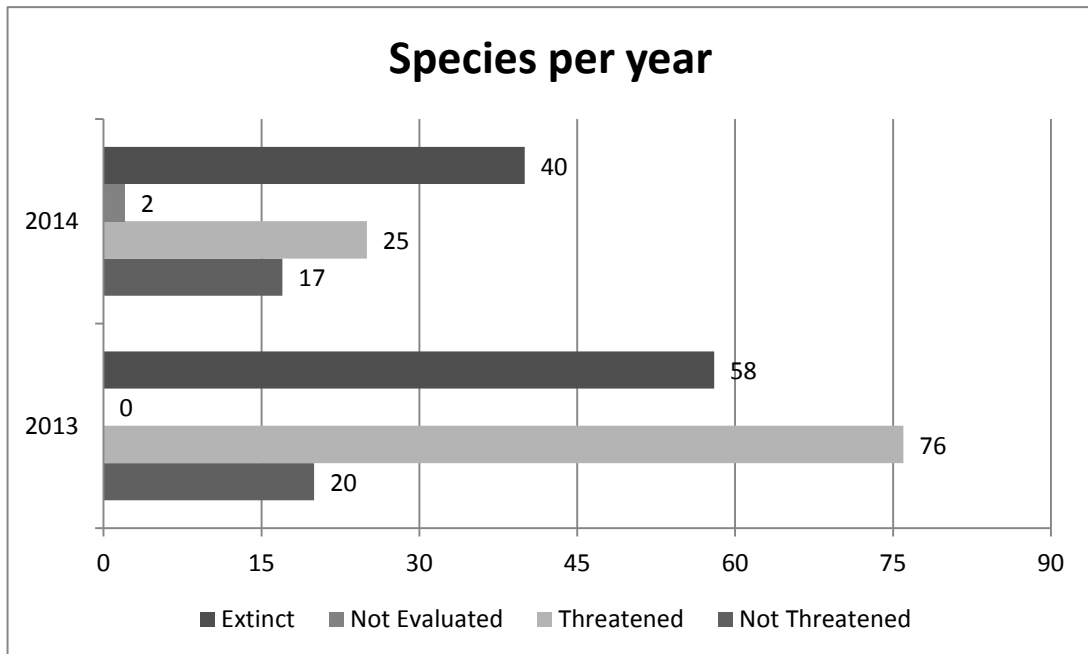
Use formulae and/or functions for ALL calculations in the spreadsheet. Use absolute cell references only where necessary to ensure that formulae are correct when you copy it to other cells in the same column (copy down). All formulae and/or functions should be inserted in such a manner that the correct results will still be obtained even if changes are made to the existing data.

Data on threatened plants has been collected and summarised in this spreadsheet.

Open the **3Plant** spreadsheet. Work in the **Plants_Plante** worksheet.

- 3.1 Change the height of **row 1** to 40 pt. (1)
- 3.2 Add the heading 'List of Plants' in **cell A1** as follows:
- Use the font type 'Aharoni'.
 - Apply any pattern style of your choice to the cell. (3)
- 3.3 Use the freeze pane feature to ensure that the contents in **row 1** and **row 2** remain on the screen if the user scrolls down. (2)
- 3.4 Use a cell formatting feature to display the headings in **row 2** over TWO lines. (1)
- 3.5 Apply an orange border around **cells A2:E79**. (1)
- 3.6 Add a function in **cell E3** to determine the number of plants that have the word 'Sugarbush' in their species name (**column B**). (5)

3.7 Use the data in the **Summary** worksheet to create a chart/graph to look like the example below. This chart/graph should appear in the **Summary** worksheet.



HINT: Take the following chart/graph characteristics into account when answering this question:

- The type of chart/graph
- The rows and columns are switched
- The labels on both axes
- The title of the chart/graph
- The legend
- The intervals on the axes
- Data labels

QUESTION 4: SPREADSHEET

Use formulae and/or functions for ALL calculations in the spreadsheet. Use absolute cell references only where necessary to ensure that formulae are correct when you copy it to other cells in the same column (copy down). All formulae and/or functions should be inserted in such a manner that the correct results will still be obtained even if changes are made to the existing data.

A spreadsheet has been created to summarise the status of the ecosystem.

Open the **4StatsData** spreadsheet. Work in the **Stats** worksheet.

4.1 Format the worksheet as follows to improve the readability:

4.1.1 Merge and centre the text in **cells A1:J1**. (2)

4.1.2 Ensure that all the headings in **row 2** are similarly aligned, with the text clearly visible and readable, by adjusting the text direction. (2)

4.2 Insert a function in **cell C3** to determine the average number of hectares (**column B**) used in this conservation survey. (2)

4.3 Apply conditional formatting to **column E** to display all the negative values in a red font colour and all the positive values in a blue font colour. (4)

4.4 The threat status is stored in **column G**.

Use a LOOKUP function in **cell F3** and the data in the **Code_Kode** worksheet to determine what the threat status code for each species is, based on the threat status in **column G**.

Display only the abbreviation, for example EN.

The function must work correctly if copied down to the rest of the cells in **column F**. (6)

4.5 Insert an IF-function in **cell H3** to determine the protection level of the species using the conservation target data (**column D**) as follows:

- A conservation target of more than 30 should display a protection level of 'Well'.
- A conservation target of more than 25 and less than or equal to 30 should display a protection level of 'Moderate'.
- The rest of the conservation targets should display a protection level of 'Poor'.

Copy the function to the rest of the cells in **column H**. (6)

- 4.6 Use a combination of text functions in **cell I4** to create a unique species code for a species name (**column A**).

The species code consists of the following:

- The first three letters of the species name (**column A**)
- Followed by the number of characters in the species name
- Followed by the threat status code (**column F**)

Example: Agt25LT will be the species code for **cell A3**.

Save and close the **4StatsData** document.

QUESTION 5: DATABASE

A database containing data on different plant species has been created.

Open the **5CFKData** database.

5.1 Change the design of the **Plant** table as follows:

5.1.1 Change the field size of the *FamilyCommon* field to 50. (1)

5.1.2 Change the field properties of the *EndemicSpecies* field so that:

- It is a required field
- The data in this field is displayed in fixed format (2)

5.1.3 Change the properties of the *Listing* field so that the user can choose from the options 'Endangered' or 'Threatened' when entering data. (2)

5.1.4 Create an input mask for the *PlantCode* field to accept data in the following format:

- ONE compulsory letter
- Followed by at least TWO but possibly THREE characters that could consist of either digits or letters
- Display in capital letters

Example: KLM, YM9R, GH2 or C123

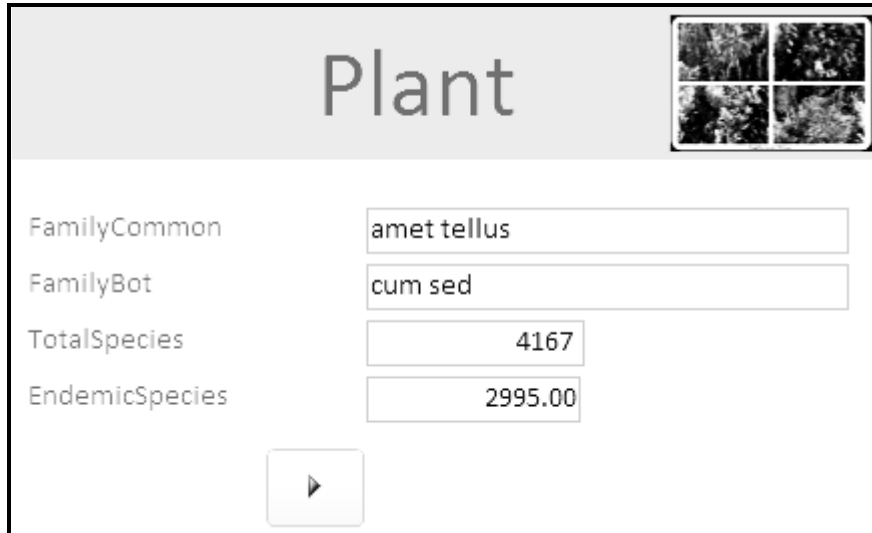
NOTE: Ignore any warning messages that may appear. (5)

5.1.5 Set the primary key on a more appropriate field. (1)

Save and close the **Plant** table.

- 5.2 Create a form called **frm5_2** based on the **Plant** table, containing the following fields: *FamilyCommon*, *FamilyBot*, *TotalSpecies* and *EndemicSpecies*.

The form should resemble the example below.

The following should be taken into consideration:

- Only add the fields required as shown on the form above.
- The font size of the heading is 36 pt.
- Note the alignment of the heading.
- The background of the form header is yellow.
- The image **5Erica.jpg** in your examination folder is displayed in the form header, as shown above.
- Add a button from the available controls to the form. The action of the button is to move to the next record.

Save and close the **frm5_2** form.

- 5.3 Create a query called **qry5_3**.

The query must use the **Plant** table to only display the *FamilyCommon* and *FamilyBot* fields of all records where the number of *EndemicSpecies* is more than 1200.

Save and close the **qry5_3** query.

5.4 Open the **qry5_4** query.

- Sort and display the *FamilyBot* field in descending order.
- Insert and display a calculated field called *Perc* which will calculate the percentage that *EndemicSpecies* is of the *TotalSpecies* for each record.

Save and close the **qry5_4** query.

5.5 Create a report called **rpt5_5** based on the **Plant** table.

- Show only the *FamilyCommon*, *FamilyBot*, *EndemicSpecies* and *Genus* fields.
- Group the records according to the *EndemicSpecies* field.
- Display the report in landscape format.
- Insert a function to calculate the average number of ALL the endemic species in the report.
- Round off the answer to ONE decimal place.
- Add a descriptive label to the calculation.
- Ensure that all the data displays fully.

Save and close the **rpt5_5** report.

Save and close the **5CFKData** database.

QUESTION 6: WEB DESIGN (HTML)

You were asked to complete a web page on fynbos species.

Open the incomplete **6Home** web page in a web browser and also in a text/HTML editor.


NOTE:

- Question numbers are inserted as comments in the coding to show approximately where the answer(s) should be inserted.
- An HTML tag sheet has been attached for reference.

Your final web page should look like the example below.

Fynbos Information

1. Erica
2. Protea



Fynbos is the most prolific plant type found in the Cape Floral Kingdom. The Cape Floral Kingdom is the largest of 6 floral kingdoms found worldwide.

There are four main types of plants found in the Fynbos. These are **Erica**, **Protea**, **Restio** and **Geophytes** (plants with underground food sources).

- The image must appear below the horizontal line, as shown in the example on the previous page.
- The height of the image must be 191 and the width 181.
- The text 'Nevillea' should display if the picture cannot be displayed. (6)

6.7 Display the text 'Erica' in the second paragraph in bold. (1)

6.8 Insert a link on the words 'Website References' to link to the document **6Ref.docx** in your examination folder. (3)

6.9 Format the table as follows:

- Add a border with a thickness of 2 to the table.
- Change the spacing between the cells to 1.
- Change the background colour of the first row to any colour of your choice. (3)

- 7.3 You were asked to assist with the analysis of data about lemurs stored in the **7End** database.

Open the **7Answ_Antw** word processing document and insert your examination number in the document.

This question requires you to give the answer and briefly explain the specific method/formula/function you used to obtain the answer.

EXAMPLE:

QUESTION	BRIEF EXPLANATION	ANSWER
How many boys are in the Grade 12A class?	Filter to extract the boys of 12A and then use the Count function.	24

- 7.3.4 How many types of lemur families are there? (2)

- 7.3.5 What is the average size of all the endangered species? (2)
