

PROVINCIAL ENGAGEMENT IN THE LIMPOPO PROVINCE



The Director-General's (DG) provincial engagement in the Limpopo Province

The provincial engagements were initiated by the Director-General (DG) three years ago with an intention to improve quality learning and teaching across all nine provinces. These engagements create a platform for education officials to discuss educational issues as a collective with the intention to turn public schools into centres of excellence.

Basic Education Director-General, Mr Hubert Mathanzima Mweli, spent five days visiting various districts in the Limpopo province where he met with education officials at provincial and district levels. The first engagement was held in Waterberg District on 05 March 2018, followed by another meeting in Vhembe District on 07 March 2018. Other visits were conducted in Tzaneen on 08 March 2018, in Sekhukhune on 12 March 2018 and in Capricorn District on 14 March 2018. To date, Mr Mweli visited five provinces and is satisfied with the level of cooperation shown by provinces and districts, particularly on issues of policy implementation.

In his address, the DG commended district officials and school principals for attending all the provincial engagements. Mr Mweli encouraged the provincial officials to keep working hard to assist underperforming districts to perform above the 70% threshold. Two districts in the province performed within the range of 50% to 59% whereas the other two districts performed within the threshold of 60% to 69.9%. Limpopo Province had one district, which performed above the 70% threshold during the 2017 National Senior Certificate (NSC) Examinations. The DG said: "This province must be commended for having registered an improvement of 3.6% in 2017. Even though it may be seen as a small increase in Limpopo, it makes a huge difference in the overall performance nationally".

Mr Mweli stated that school principals should be given full support to strengthen the education system. "This will enable public schools to perform at the same desired level," added the Director-General. Mr Mweli said that there are several reasons why these visits are conducted in provinces, namely:

 To reflect on the resolutions emanating from the Basic Education Sector Lekgotla, which was hosted at Saint George's Hotel from 22-24 January 2018;

- To strengthen alignment in the sector from National to Provincial, District, down to classroom level;
- To carry out Minister's obligations in terms of National Education Policy Act (NEPA), Act no 27 of 1996, Section 8; which mandates DBE senior officials to monitor policy implementation at provincial level;
- To strengthen strategies aimed at providing quality education in public schools;
- To reach out to various role players in the value chain of providing quality education to close ranks in realizing the objectives and goals of the National Development Plan.

The DBE's Acting Director for System Administrations, Mr Hilton Visagie, who made a presentation on *the 2016 Progress in International Reading Literacy Study (PIRLS)*, emphasized that teachers will have to focus more on improving reading levels in lower grades in order to achieve quality passes in the education sector. "The promotion of a reading revolution is a call for all officials, parents and guardians to ensure that children embrace reading as one of the important attributes to success," said Mr Vissagie.

Limpopo Deputy Director-General for Curriculum, Ms Onicca Khathutshelo Dederen, acknowledged Mr Mweli's efforts in ensuring that officials at the provincial level are empowered with an in-depth knowledge around issues relating to curriculum coverage in public schools. "I commend Mr Mweli and his team for spending quality time in our province. We really learn a lot from these engagements. Thank you once more for your continued support in engaging key education officials who are responsible for improving learning outcomes in our schools," she added.

The District Director for Vhembe District, Dr Nthambeleni Rambiyana said that, "different strategies are already in place to improve quality learning and teaching in all phases. "Although the main focus to improve language competency begins from Grade 4, learners in the Foundation Phase should also be prepared to grow up with the love for books," remarked Dr Rambiyana.

The District Director for Mopani District, Dr Livhuwani Mafenya, concluded the meeting by acknowledging the presentations made by the DBE team. Mafenya highlighted that she plans to initiate more intervention programmes to ensure that schools function effectively. "As the Mopani District, we will work hard to close the learning gaps identified

through the presentations. First thing that we need to do is to ensure that our intervention programmes are not targeted only at learners in Grade 12 but the entire education sector," remarked Dr Mafenya.









QUANTITATIVE FEEDBACK FROM PROVINCIAL AND DISTRICT OFFICIALS








I will be able to use presentations to improve learning outcomes




