STEPS TO FOLLOW 2

Presenting legal arguments

Moot argument must be based on the law Decide what you want to argue (identify sections from the Constitution) It is a practical and experiential learning programme, with the Constitution as its core component. The programme forms part of Human rights education and assists learners to understand that everyone has an inherent right to be treated equally and with dignity. It further inculcates in the learner the view of the supremacy of the Constitution and the rule of law. Lastly, it is the gate way towards a career in the legal profession and active responsible citizenry.

Arrange each point in a sensible (practical) order

Familiarize yourself with the area of law in question (Resource Pack)

Make a proper note of the full citations upon which you intend to rely on

Refer to authorities for every passage cited from a judgment Rebuttal: applicant should listen carefully and respond to the respondant
