Response: The following progress has been recorded

# a) Kwazulu Natal (KZN)

Furthermore, the NECT was appointed by the DBE to assit he province with condition assessment as well as verification of costs. The NECT report was received on 31 August 2022 and is being assessed for further processing.

## Eastern Cape

A total of 51 Schools were reported to have been affected by the Floods in Eastern Cape. These covered mainly three districts, Amathole East, Chris Hani and O R Tambo Coastal District. The DBE visited a sample of 37 schools in all three Districts.

## **QUESTION 385.**

The majority of schools were found to have problems with old roofs, which leaked when it rains. A total of 27 Schools were also found to have been damaged by the floods, mainly in Amathole East District. The DBE appointed the NECT to assist with conditional assessment of these schools and to provide the costs. The NECT report was received on 31 August 2022, and is being analysed for further processing.

North West: No schools were found to have been damaged by the floods in the North West Province.

b) The DBE is looking at mechanisms to institutionalise response to disasters. A Ministerial Task Team was appointed to coordinate DBE response to the disaster in this instance.
